BRUSSELS NATIONAL AIRPORT (brusselsairport.com)

Railway station is located under the airport

- 2 connections per hour / about 15 minutes / € 8,90
- First train at 05:21, last train at 00:47 (on Sat and Sun at 05:10 and 23:38)

BRUSSELS SOUTH CHARLEROI AIRPORT (charleroi-airport.com)

Small lowcost airport 50 km outside of Brussels, in Charleroi. No direct connections to Leuven. You have to take the shuttle bus to Brussels first (takes about 1 hour). If you have a delay and have no more connection to Brussels, a taxi to Leuven will cost you €130.

Shuttle bus to Brussels 1: Euro Coach shuttle

- schedule varies (eurocoachshuttle.be); drives 1 hour to Brussels (to 'Zuid/Midi' train station)
- one-way for € 10
- buy a ticket on the bus (go left to find their blue & yellow bus) or online

Shuttle bus to Brussels 2: Brussels city shuttle

- two per hour; drives 1 hour to Brussels (to 'Zuid/Midi' train station)
- one-way for € 17 (online € 5 - 14)
- buy a ticket outside of the airport (follow the blue line) or online (brussels-city-shuttle.com)

From Brussels 'Zuid / Midi' to Leuven:

- 5 trains per hour / about 30 minutes / € 5,30
- First train at 05:12, last train at 00:21 (on Sat and Sun at 05:56 and 23:14)

=> some Eurolines buses stop in Leuven, but most international buses only stop in Brussels.

Eurolines stops at Brussels 'Noord / Nord' station, Megabus stops near Brussels 'Central' station, IDBus stops at Brussels 'Zuid / Midi' station. It will be no problem to catch a train from Brussels to Leuven, but watch out: buses often have a delay, so you might have to spend the night in Brussels if you're late.

=> international trains to and from Belgium. International trains don't stop in Mechelen, only in Brussels 'Zuid / Midi' and Antwerp central station. If you come from Paris or Cologne: get out in Brussels, If you come from Amsterdam: get out in Antwerp and transfer to Leuven

Eurostar = international high-speed train between the UK, France and Belgium.

Thalys = international high-speed train between France, Belgium and the Netherlands.


TIP: Travelling with friends

- 25 or younger Go-Pass (10 rides for € 51)
- older than 25 Rail Pass (10 rides for € 76)

Both passes can be used between all Belgian stations with more than 1 person at the same time.

Tip: Travelling alone

- one-way trips Go-Pass One (one-way ticket to anywhere in Belgium for € 6)
* only -26 years old. Buy from ticketing machines in stations or print at home
- return trips Weekend ticket (usually almost half the price of regular ones)
* only during weekends



Leuven lies very close to Brussels, with many direct connections. Train from Brussels to Leuven = €5,30 There are 3 stations in Brussels: 'Zuid/ Midi', 'Central' and 'Noord / Nord'.

All Belgian trains stop in these three stations, so you can choose. Brussels 'Noord / Nord' is closest to Leuven.

IC-trains (InterCity) go faster than IR-trains (Inter-Regional). Don't take slow L-trains (local).
